“ARTS ON TOUR” AND OTHERS FUND MUSIC PROGRAMS

Schools, arts councils and other groups in Kansas and nearby states find that bringing Ann to sing is easier with extra funding.

The “Arts on Tour” program of the Kansas Arts Commission provides state-funded support for a few of Ann's concerts each year. Ann is also part of the Mid-America Arts Alliance, which provides grant money not only for Kansas, but for Missouri, Nebraska, Arkansas, Oklahoma and Texas as well. Both programs include funding from the National Endowment for the Arts with a goal of enriching cultural life. They include special incentives for rural and economically challenged areas.

Ann has been part of both programs for several years and has just submitted her renewal application.

Artists are chosen by panels of judges who review the artists' work, selecting the best of the region. These programs pay a percentage of the cost of performance; the local sponsor pays the rest. More funding is good for the audience and good for the musician.

ANN MIXES MUSIC & MEDIATION SKILLS

Each summer, the Summer Music Symposium at Kansas State University brings school music teachers together for learning and enjoyment. This year Ann was invited to speak to elementary music teachers from across the state about her music and songwriting workshops.

In an unexpected twist, Symposium organizers also urged Ann to switch professional hats. At their request, Ann included a workshop on negotiation, mediation and communication skills for that same group of teachers—who received it with enthusiasm. Since Ann spends about half of her work time doing mediations and other “alternative dispute resolution,” it was a natural change of pace.
